1                                    An act to ensure safety and equality for those with Albinism in East Africa.

3                                    **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5    Justification Clause: In recent years, the murder and mistreatment of Africans with Albinism has dramatically  
6    increased. Africans with Albinism are murdered and their body parts are sold off as novelty items for the  
7    purposes of witchcraft. This has turned many tribes against each other. If no action is taken this problem will  
8    continue to increase, causing greater international tension than already exists.

10   Section I: Currently, there are five East African countries with reports of Albinism murders and mistreatment.  
11   These countries include: Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, Burundi, and Rwanda. Since 2010, 71 albinos have been  
12   killed in Tanzania and 31 others have been slain in Burundi. Cases of human sacrifice in Uganda have become  
13   daily front page news. At least 45,000 with Albinism have been displaced or gone into hiding.

15   Section II: Rwandan people with Albinism suffer severe segregation in society and in education. People with  
16   Albinism in East Africa are regularly denied education and cannot afford or find proper housing, as  
17   discovered in a documentary by The Nation Public Radio. The sun is deadly to people with Albinism so proper  
18   housing is a necessity.

20   Section III: We propose The United Nations assists in finding refuge for people with Albinism in other  
21   countries such as Egypt, South Africa, and Cape Verde. We also propose that The United Nations issues  
22   statements to the five countries currently involved, advising immediate action to resolve the issue.

24   Section IV: This proposal will go into effect six months after passage.
