1 An act to develop and implement a global strategy that combats transnational organized crime (TOC) and
2 terrorist acts across borders.
3

4 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

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6 Justification Clause: Today, organized crime comes at us from every corner of the globe. We have to work to
7 cripple these national and transnational syndicates with every capability and tool we've got: undercover
8 operations; confidential sources; surveillance; intelligence analysis and sharing; forensic accounting; multi-
9 agency investigations; and the power of racketeering statutes that help us take down entire enterprises. We
10 also have to work closely with our international partners—in some cases, swapping personnel—to build
11 cases and disrupt groups with global ties.

13 Section I: Each year, transnational organized crime generates an estimated \$870 billion, threatening peace
14 and human security, leading to human rights being violated and undermining economic, social, cultural and
15 political development of societies around the world.

17 Section II: In the absence of a global strategy, TOC continues to grow. It is time for an international
18 campaign by all sectors of society to develop a global consensus for action against TOC. Combating a global
19 phenomenon such as transnational organized crime requires partnerships at all levels. Governments,
20 businesses, civil society, international organizations and people in all corners of the world have a part to
21 play.

23 Section III: This proposal requires the UN Member Nations to fully develop and implement a global strategy
24 to combat transnational organized crime. The strategy will take the U.S. Department of Defense's Counter-
25 narcotics & Global Threats Strategy, expand on its policies and further develop the procedures for handling
26 TOC properly.
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28 Section IV: The UN Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC) in conjunction with INTERPOL, the International
29 Criminal Court and the Defense Departments of each UN Member Nation will be responsible for the
30 implementation of the global strategy once it is developed.

32 Section V: This proposal will go into effect six months after passage.
