We also have to work closely with our international partners—in some cases, swapping personnel—to build cases and disrupt groups with global ties. |
| 13 14 15 16 | Section I: Each year, transnational organized crime generates an estimated \$870 billion, threatening peace and human security, leading to human rights being violated and undermining economic, social, cultural and political development of societies around the world. |
| 17 18 19 20 21 22 | Section II: In the absence of a global strategy, TOC continues to grow. It is time for an international campaign by all sectors of society to develop a global consensus for action against TOC. Combating a global phenomenon such as transnational organized crime requires partnerships at all levels. Governments, businesses, civil society, international organizations and people in all corners of the world have a part to play. |
| 23 24 25 26 27 | Section III: This proposal requires the UN Member Nations to fully develop and implement a global strategy to combat transnational organized crime. The strategy will take the U.S. Department of Defense's Counter- narcotics & Global Threats Strategy, expand on its policies and further develop the procedures for handling TOC properly. |
| 28 29 30 | Section IV: The UN Office of Drugs and Crime (UNODC) in conjunction with INTERPOL, the International Criminal Court and the Defense Departments of each UN Member Nation will be responsible for the implementation of the global strategy once it is developed. |
