1 An act to form a committee to create an individualized test for Special Education students.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

5 Section 1: Students in the Special Education program take the same standardized test as all other students.
6 While some Special Education students have common disabilities, some have severe disabilities (some even
7 struggling to write).

8

9 Section 2: Students in Special Education should receive a different test than other students. Special
10 Education students who spend more time in the Special Education classroom learning in unique ways should
11 take a unique test.

13 Section 3: Each school district will form a committee with their special education staff that will create tests
14 for their special education students. The Kentucky Department of Education will supervise these committees
15 and approve their tests.

16

17 Section 4: Each committee will designate a secure location to have their meetings. The committees will
18 decide which special education students need a different test, and what will be on the test. The Department
19 of Education will decide the dates for the committees to meet.

20

21 Section 5: This bill will take effect at the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year, and will apply to all public
22 schools in Kentucky.
