1 An act to require all police dogs in the State of Kentucky to have bulletproof and stab proof vests available
2 while on active duty.
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: This bill will require a vest be fitted for a K9 while under-going police training, so the dog will have
7 the vest available to it, before it goes into active duty.

9 Section 2: The cost of this vest will be split equally between the State and the police department receiving
10 the vest. The total cost for one vest is \$640. The State's share would be \$320, and the local police
11 department's ay \$320. Monies for this will come from confiscated drugs and unclaimed stolen merchandise.

13 Section 3: Six months after this bill is passed, every active duty K9 must have a vest available. Police
14 departments will receive 2 warnings before being fined. The fine will be \$500 the first offense, \$1000 the
15 second offense. On the third offense, the dog will be removed from the police department and placed with
16 another willing to provide the vest.
