An act to require all Kentucky Public School staff members have Safe Crisis Management Training

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Every year the schools in Kentucky enroll more students with emotional and behavioral disorders, endangering not only the students, but the staff also. As of now, Safe Crisis Management training (how to properly restrain a child) is optional for all staff members. We always want to improve our school system; this is an A-list advancement our state needs.

Section 2: There are 1,233 public schools in Kentucky. There are 16, 984 staff members working in these schools everyday with 675,530 students. This number includes all teachers, bus drivers, receptionists, nurses, sports team coaches, and librarians. All of these people have dedicated their lives to teaching. The least we can do is further ensure not only the teacher's but also the student's safety.

Section 3: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education; this is also where the funding will be coming from. If any of the schools in a Kentucky school district fail to provide Safe Crisis Management trining for the staff member's certification or professional credentials will be suspended.

Section 4: Safe Crisis Management training will need to be renewed every year.

Section 5: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are considered null and void.

Section 6: This bill will go in effect August 2014.
