1 An act to require students over 14 to get a drug test in school.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This act will require anyone over the age of 14 in middle and high school to have a drug test done
6 in school at least once a year.

7
8 Section 2: This bill will affect our students and their grades; teen drug abuse kills 200,000 people a year.

9
10 Section 3: Schools will become required for their students to get drug test done one time a year, this will
11 cost \$50. If schools want this done twice a year then it would be \$50 extra which would be a total of \$100 a
12 year. It will be required to have at least one drug test done a year.

13
14 Section 4: The students will have thirty-five too sixty days to fix their drug abuse.

15
16 Section 5: The school/school district will pay \$100 a year if they have two drug tests a year. They will have
17 locker checks, but only if you test positive for locker checks will they search inside your locker.

18
19 Section 6: The school board and county police department will enforce this bill.

21 Section 7: If a student fails the drug test:

22
23 First Offense will be suspension and fine with county police department.

24 Second offense will be in-school counseling and fine with county police department.

25 Third offense will be explosion to an alternative school and fine with county police department.

26
27 Section 8: This bill will take effect in 2015-2016.
