1 2	An act to improve race relations between Native Fijians and Indians
- 3 4	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
5 6 7 8 9	Justification Clause: In the late 1800's British settlers brought workers from India to work on sugar plantations. Over time, natives were being overwhelmed by expanding numbers of Indians. In recent years, conflicts have arisen over balances in power between the groups, which led to coups and loss of life. As recently as 2009, there was a Fijian Constitutional Crisis.
10 11	Section I: Send a Fijian Peace-Keeping Committee to observe and make recommendations to the government to reduce racial tension therefore improving the lives of all.
12 13 14 15	Section II: The government of Fiji would provide housing (room & board) and transportation to the committee members during the stay.
16 17 18	Section III: The United Nations should approve the committee for a period of two years. A review process would be used to determine whether future assistance would be required.
19 20 21 22 23	Section IV: The committee's duties would include, but not be limited to: visiting major islands, promoting social equality, helping to form community groups to educate future generations/leaders, adding social responsibility classes in schools, observe & advise local/national leaders. Venues should include: city centers, schools, churches and rugby events.
24 25	Section V: Committee members should include: former heads of state/leaders, sociologists, psychologist, communications specialists, education specialists.
26 27	Section VI: Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations, 30 days following passage.
