An act to create peace by forming interconnecting communities and nations in the Middle East and northern Africa.

## Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Clause 1: On January 1, 2016, the administrative districts of Syria will have a referendum to decide their political status. They could opt to join a pro-Assad state, an opposition state, and a Kurdish state. Also, a referendum in Kurdish majority districts of Iraq and Turkey shall have a referendum to decide to join the new Kurdish state. All referendums will be supervised by the Arab League Military Force. All new Syrian nations shall have access to ports on the Mediterranean.

Clause 2: Starting on January 1, 2015, Israel and Turkey will become members of the Arab League and Arab Parliament. Israel will obtain six votes in the Arab Parliament and Turkey would obtain four. Hebrew and Turkish will be added as official languages of the Arab League. Israel's military operation will remain independent of the Arab League. The Arab League will form a separate Arab League Military Force (ALMF) not consisting of already registered soldiers of the member nations.

Clause 3: On January, 1, 2017, a new nation of Palestine will be created using the original 1968 boundaries.

Clause 4: Palestine will not draft nor create an official army, navy, or air force, until the year 2035 and shall remain a protectorate of the Arab League.

Clause 5: All Arab League nations shall sign a free trade agreement by 2015. In addition, all borders shared by members of the Arab League shall become open by January 1, 2017.

Clause 6: The establishment of an non-religiously affiliated Arab League University system with campuses in the capital cities of all Arab League nations. All Arab League Universities shall be funded by the Arab League, the nations of the Arab League, and by American and European universities aligned with the system.

Clause 7: The formation of an Arab League Bank by January 1, 2015. The Arab League Parliament shall appoint a Board of Governors who will oversee the Arab League Bank. The Arab League Bank shall be responsible for giving out private business loans and encouraging private commerce.

Clause 8: The newly created nations of Kurdistan as well as the border between the two states of Syria shall be defended by the ALMF with initial assistance from American, Russian, and United Nations peacekeepers.

Clause 9: Allow any ethnic minorities to travel to a new county during a period in which peacekeepers will provide protection.
