4 5	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Justification Clause: The right to asylum is a concept under which a person persecuted by his or her country may be protected by another country or sovereign authority. In 2012, over 320,000 people sought asylum in the European Union alone. While most of these people had good intentions, there are the select few trying to seek refuge from going to trial for crimes they committed. A prime example would be Edward Snowden seeking refuge in Russia. This act will prevent criminals applying for foreign asylum from leaving the country in which they have committed a crime.
13 14 15 16 17 18	Section I: In article 14 of the universal declaration of human rights, set up by the United Nations it states that everyone has the right to seek asylum in foreign countries except in the case of persecutions of non political crimes, or acts contrary to the purpose and principles of the United Nations. This bill will make it illegal for a person convicted of any crimes both political and nonpolitical from seeking refuge in foreign countries.
19 20 21 22 23	Section II: The current application process for foreign asylum is through filing immigration forms, a written personal statement, documents supporting your story, and country condition documentation. This bill bill mandate that a person's country of origin will be notified that they are seeking asylum, and it is up to the country's discretion whether or not they want to run a background check.
24 25 26	Section III: If the country runs a background check and discovers that the person is in the process of being convicted of a crime, they can deny said person the right of asylum.
27 28 29	Section IV: Funds for this program are up to the individual country's discretion based upon the decision to run background checks or not.
30	Section V: This bill will be enacted January 1, 2015.
