This proposal asks the United Nations for funding to provide staff to inspect all cocoa farms in Colombia. This will decrease the production

11 12 13 14 15 16	Section I: To hire 50 inspectors and provide transportation for the inspectors, we are proposing for a United Nations grant of \$500,000 from the United Nations Drug Control Programe and the Centere for International Crime Prevention (UNODC). This will cover the annual salary of the workers, transportation and any housing expenses. This will benefit many countries such as the United States and Europe by decreasing their drug imports.
17 18 19 20	Section II: Inspectors will look for the components to make cocaine including battery acid, gasoline, and other chemicals. If excessive amounts of suspicious materials are found, the suspect(s) will be subject to laws already in place for those who violate the laws.
20 21 22	Section III: This will be enforced by the United Nations by monitoring the inspections.
23 24 25 26	Section IV: Colombia exports cocaine to the United States, Europe, Canada, and Mexico. The decrease in cocaine production will decrease the use of this illegal drug in these countries, benefiting them greatly. Other countries can also use this proposal as a basis to create their own proposal to stop production in their countries.

28 Section V: This proposal will go into effect 6 months after passage.
