An act to abolish human trafficking and raise awareness for traficking victims.

## Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: Human trafficking is trading people into slavery. It is unfortunately popular in Argentina. Because Argentina's long borders, human traffickers have easy transport to and with their victims. Argentina is the "hotspot" for human trafficking. Most cases of human trafficking involve forced labor and prostitution. Human trafficking is a form of modern slavery. Trafficking happens 77% of the time to women. Although there aren't as many women as men in the labor force, how women are treated is getting better.

Section I: In 2008, 122 people were convicted of human trafficking and 511 were facing charges. Human traffickers, if they are caught, can be imprisoned for 3 to 15 years. The Argentine government has issued an anti-trafficking legislature in 2009. However, the exploitation that is human trafficking is becoming harder and harder to prove and extinguish.

Section II: The average age of human trafficking victims is 12–64. Argentine women and girls are sexually exploited in other countries like Bolivia, Peru, Dominican Republic, and Paraguay, not just Argentina.

Section III: The solution to this problem is simple. Make laws and law enforcement stricter on human trafficking. Argentina can train officers on how to identify trafficking and how to stop it. With tougher law and regulations, sexual exploitation will dramatically decrease.
