1 2	An act to to restructure the education system in Bolivia
2 3 4	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
5 6 7 8	Justification Clause: Bolivian education is lacking, and where there is schooling available it is primarily in urban areas. Citizens who live in rural areas are not getting the education that they need, and several of them are illiterate.
9 10 11 12 13	Section 1: The education system in Bolivia is very limited, and needs restructuring. Education in Bolivia, as in many other areas of Bolivian life, has a major divide between Bolivia's rural and urban areas. The illiteracy levels remain high in rural areas, even as the rest of the country becomes increasingly literate. This problem is caused by a lack of funding, to which the citizens who live in these rural areas, cannot contribute to.
14 15 16 17 18 19	Section 2: The spending in Bolivia is primarily in favor of urban citizens. Approximately 60% of Bolivia's 59,000 teachers were employed in urban schools. School time is split into 2 shifts (morning and afternoon) so everything is compressed and there is little time for things that make education enjoyable. State schools are underfunded and in poor repair too. The goal for this bill is to create not only a budget for education but to recreate how the school is run.
20 21 22	Section 3: In order to create a well sustained and equal education system, Bolivia will need approximately \$20 million for the restructuring of the system.
23 24 25 26 27 28	Section 4: Bolivia will use this money to create more schools in rural areas and to maintain and employ them. This will also provide money for books and other necessities for the school. This is needed because as stated in section 2, Bolivian schools has more teachers in the urban areas rather than in rural ones. This will also reschedule the session of when school is, making it from two sessions a day, to only one longer session. Essentially, this will make school easier for teachers, and more enjoyable for students.
29 30 31 32 33	Section 5: The money will also be used to build community colleges, essentially allowing better availability of further education for those citizens who don't have the opportunity to go and get a degree. Most of these colleges will be built in areas where there are no other colleges in a reasonable distance, primarily in rural areas.
