An act to create better military units in South American Countries

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Section 1: Costa Rica has no standing military. The budget that was previously dedicated to the military is now dedicated to security, education and culture. In addition, to giving Costa Rica money we are going to send UN qualified trainers, so they can train law enforcement. This group of people will also help other countries in that region.

Section 2: Costa Rica needs some kind of help in terms of law enforcement. Costa Rica, like other Latin American countries faces a variety of security threats that test the country's security capacity. Major national security issues include border control, drug trafficking and the expansion of international criminal organizations into the country. An example of these criminal organizations is the Mexican Sinaloa drug cartel.

Section 3: In order to create a sufficient and strong military, Costa Rica will need approximately \$15 million dollars granted from the United Nations.

Section 4: This assistance from the United Nations will not only benefit Costa Rica but that whole region and it will help reduce drug trafficking, people trying to come across the border (illegally), and most security problems.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect 2 years after passage.
