1 An act to lower air pollution in Greece caused by Greece's economic crisis.

3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5 Justification Clause: Greece is going through a economic crisis which is causing an increase in air pollution
6 within the country. The economic crisis in Greece is affecting the average income of families. The average
7 income for families in Greece is \$27,644.42, or 20,202 euros. With the economic crisis also comes a higher
8 unemployment rate and the ages of the members of society able to obtain a job is suffering as well. The
9 unemployment rate is 28% as of November of 2013. This causes the people of Greece to take desperate
10 affordable measures to heat their homes and to stay warm. The cost of natural gas is extremely high and
11 the use of burning wood is taking its place.
