1 An act to create a disaster response and mitigation system prototyped in Grenada and then used in the rest
2 of the world.
3

4 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**
5

6 Section I: Repairs to major disasters, mainly due to hurricanes, in Grenada can cost millions in repairs alone
7 and affects thousands of lives yearly. It can take up to five years for full recovery from disasters, such as,
8 hurricanes, tsunamis and earthquakes. The chances for such events are increased by their location on the
9 Atlantic Hurricane Belt.

11 Section II: We are planning to create a prototype system called the United Nations Emergency Response and
12 Rescue Team (UNERRTi) to help prepare for and lessen the impact of disasters in Grenada. This will include
13 a hotline for disaster alerts, safe houses, and teams to help with clean up and rescue. These teams will be
14 made up of volunteer members, as well as paid supervisors that will be responsible for the planning,
15 preparation, and delivery of these response systems. This team would exist for a three-year period. After
16 that, the team will be reviewed for effectiveness and to see if these efforts can be employed in other parts of
17 the world.

19 Section III: This team would be made up of 24 emergency response experts and administrators, all of which
20 would receive a yearly salary of \$75000 (\$US). The resources at their disposal for rescue and clean up,
21 including but not limited to earth moving equipment, helicopters, rescue vehicles, etc. are estimated to cost
22 \$1.4 million. Operational costs for these items, including fuel, maintenance costs, etc., are estimated to cost
23 \$50000 (\$US) annually. This cost for the three-year existence of the team, totaling \$3350000 (\$US) would
24 come from the UNICEF fund.

26 Section IV: This proposal would go into effect on January 1st, 2015.
