Justification Clause: The population of Israel is increasing by 1.9% a year. The average population of a country grows by .6% a year. Because of this, there are more cars on the road and the air is becoming more polluted. Every year, air pollution is fatal to two million people around the world. In the country of Israel, less than 30% of their people use the public transportation system. If more people decided to use the public transportation system such as buses or trains, Israel could save up to one hundred million dollars a year. A bus company called Metropoline is trying to make their busses more appealing to the public. There is also a larger bus company called Egged in Israel.

Section I: The U.N. would loan Metropoline and Egged seven-hundred fifty thousand US dollars (\$750,000) each, in return for decreasing the bus fairs by 25%. This money will replace the money they will lose by lowering the bus fairs. This would make the public transportation more affordable for Israel's citizens. This would increase the amount of people using public transportation and decrease the amount of single drivers on the roads.

Section II: Metropoline and Egged will pay 6% of their monthly income to the U.N. as soon as their profits return to their original values.

Section III: Both Metropoline and Egged will add at least one bus stop in the rural area of Israel that goes with no additional stop to the urban areas of Israel. This will allow the people of the rural areas transportation to the cities even if they cannot afford a car.

Section IV: This proposal will go into effect as soon as it is passed.
