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3 4	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
5 6 7 8 9 10	Justification Clause: Despite the end of the apartheid twenty years ago, the education system is still broken. South Africa is ranked 140 out of 144 countries in education. Black students go to school for only 3 1/2 hours a day, but white students go to school 6 1/2 hours a day. Only 28 students out of 100 who live in poor areas will graduate, and only 1 of those 28 will go on to college. 39% of black students scored a passing grade on the standardized tests, versus 90% of white students.
11 12	Section I: The United Nations shall ratify this proposal by creating the following programs.
13 14 15	Section II: Provide a network of private impact schools throughout the country, managed by private organizations that let the black students attend for free.
16 17 18 19	Section III: Work with programs like the Peace Corps and Teach Away to train teachers who are working in the black school so that they are better equipped to help the students and their families in order to close the gap in education between black and white students.
20 21 22	Section IV: Create job-training centers to teach students skills that will improve their lives in the 21st century.
23	Section V: Appoint an oversight committee to visit the schools, evaluate their effectiveness, and suggest
