1                    An act to create world awareness and hostility of the minor terrorist groups in Sri Lanka.

3                    **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5                    Justification Clause: Al Qaeda, Taliban, Hamas. What do all these strange names have in common? One  
6 word: terrorism. Terrorism is one of the biggest issues the world's society today alongside with world hunger  
7 and drinking water. Terrorism begins with a minor disagreement between two people with opinions that  
8 differ from one another. A minor argument can branch off into violent ways. The use of violence and  
9 intimidation in the pursuit of political aims is what causes terrorism to occur. We, the United States, have  
10 had several terrible instances in the past involving terrorism with the Al Qaeda such as the dreadful day of  
11 September 11th, 2001 a day that has gone down in history. Al Qaeda began as a miniscule Taliban group in  
12 a base of the Middle Eastern part of the world. They developed enough power to branch off into different  
13 countries and started causing harm to all citizens in that area and causing havoc. To this day, Al Qaeda is the  
14 largest terrorist group in the world with, unfortunately, an extreme number of followers. We all know the  
15 horrors that Al Qaeda has brought upon the world and we don't want any smaller terrorist groups growing  
16 as large as them. One minor terrorist group that may expand is a Sri Lankan minor terrorist group who has  
17 attacked several times in the past including a bus station bombing, drug trafficking and people smuggling. In  
18 order to prevent future minor extremist groups from blossoming into more deadly kinds, this proposal is put  
19 forth to try and control such small terrorist groups in Sri Lanka from expanding to other countries and  
20 causing chaos.

22                    Section I: It will be mandatory for all citizens to report to government officials of any suspicious activity  
23 such as the housing of terroristic weapons such as illegal guns, explosives, and other devices that are meant  
24 to cause harm and murder.

26                    Section II: The national TV station will provide simple PSAs (Public Service Announcements) in order to  
27 convince any confused citizens on whether they want to pursue in terrorism and/or create a realization of  
28 the severity of the terrorist groups so that the government realizes how bad it could get and attempt to  
29 control it.

31                    Section III: Establishing a proper mindset and encouraging non-violent thoughts in the education systems of  
32 Sri Lanka as well as discouraging the use of weapons in order to harm will help each generation to be less  
33 likely to grow up and become part of these terrorist groups. Teachers should encourage passivism without  
34 directing the students overall opinion.

36                    Section IV: Each major incident caused by the Sri Lankan terrorist group should be addressed by  
37 international news broadcasters such as CNN, BBC News, and FOX etc. This will bring world awareness  
38 about such terrorist groups among the citizens of every country who in turn should make every effort to  
39 eradicate the problem of terrorism and the spread of this terrible problem of society.
