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An act to acquire funding establishing a program producing solar energy systems within struggling countries.

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: Electricity is a privilege taken for granted in many first-world countries. However, in many developing countries, such as South Sudan, electricity and energy is a rarity. This proposal would work to establish a program to assist in such countries' energy issues.

Section I: In order to initiate this program, 100 million dollars would be required to pay workers from the United States, account for flights, shipping, and to purchase and acquire parts necessary for the program. The United States will ensure all workers are adequate and well-qualified for their jobs.

Section II: These funds would be used to pay workers, provided by the United States of America and purchase parts and other necessary items, in order to provide power to 1.4 million South Sudanese people. The phase of preparation and installation is expected to take two years.

Section III: 92% of funds will be allotted to the installation and production of these solar energy systems, while 8% will be directed toward proper training on upkeep of these systems.

Section IV: The second phase of the program would be training South Sudanese citizens in how to provide proper upkeep for these systems. Proper training will be carried out from experienced and qualified United States workers. A portion of the funds will be alloted to account for this training process.

Section IV: Once the South Sudanese people are trained in proper upkeep of these systems, all workers from the United States will withdraw from the country. The program will then be up for expansion in March of 2022.

Section V: This proposal shall go into effect on February 22nd, 2018.
