1 An act to send UN certified teachers to refugee camps starting with Zambia.

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3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

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5 Justification Clause: According to the United Nations High Commissioner of Refugees (UNHCR) there are
6 15.2 million refugees in camps around the world. That's 1 out of every 460 people in the world. That's a
7 huge chunk of the world's population. In refugee camps all over the world people have clean water, food and
8 shelter. However they don't all have teachers or get an education. My idea is to send UN certified teachers
9 to these camps. The UN determined that every person has the right to an education. To deny refugees that
10 would be cruel and contradictory of us.

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12 Section I: Teachers would be sent to camps at a ratio of fifteen students to one teacher. The reason for
13 such small class sizes is to make a true impact and help refugees in a positive way. Large class sizes are hard
14 enough for students who have been in school since they were very young.

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16 Section II: The incentive for going out to these camps to work would be interest would be frozen on student
17 loans while working in the camps and after a year of service their student loans would be paid off. All their
18 transportation, lodging, and food would be paid for while on service. If teachers return for more time after
19 their original trip they'd get paid \$50,000 a year. Supplies and a basic curriculum would be provided for the
20 teachers. Supplies would be based off the amenities (electricity, indoor space, running water). Teachers
21 could work in either a one year block or two six month blocks.

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23 Section III: To apply to become one of these teachers would be a short application and interview. It wouldn't
24 be too strict as we need so many. Placement will be based on the languages they know and if they match up
25 with the national language of the country. Teachers could apply to take the language of a country which
26 either isn't getting enough help or is the only country that speaks that language.

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28 Section IV: Any country that is a member of the UN can attempt to join. To join in this program, countries
29 need to show documentation that they have refugee camps without education in them. An evaluator from
30 the UN will be sent to camps in different areas of the country to see if they truly do need help. Every country
31 will be evaluated fairly regardless of the country's socioeconomic status.

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33 Section V: This proposal will go into effect 6 months after passage.
