An act for the UN to draft a compulsory resolution that would require states with a documented history of violating indigenous rights to UN inspections in order to prove that they are adhering to the declaration of rights of indigenous peoples

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: This bill is on the rights of the Aborigine people's being violated. People that are not indigenous people are estimated to live an astonishing 17 years less than indigenous people. Every measure of social and physical welfare, from infant mortality to nutrition to health, housing, education, and employment, is significantly lower for Aboriginal Australians than for non-Indigenous Australians. And all of the negative markers for disenfranchised populations—imprisonment, domestic violence, alcoholism—are much higher for Aboriginal peoples. An Aboriginal man is 13 times as likely to be in jail as a non-Indigenous Australian, and an Indigenous teenager is 28 times more likely to be in jail. This is because the government is simply unfair to the aborigine in more than one way. For example, the process of claiming land rights and the legal framework in which it operates still strongly favors the state and creates unnecessary hurdles for Indigenous Peoples.

Section 1: The UN, on behalf of all its delegated countries, would draft a compulsory resolution that would require states with a documented history of violating indigenous rights to UN inspections in order to prove that they are adhering to the declaration of rights of indigenous peoples.

Section 2: As stated in the proposal, the Aborigine is treated bad among other native tribes, therefore the UN will enforce this globally rather than domestically.

Section 3: The UN would punish violators of this resolution would have 100 hours of community service.

Section 4: The trust fund that would possible be required for any of this would be established 90 days after the passage of this proposal.

Section 5: The bill would become active 90 days after passage
