An act to reduce the percentage of sexual abuse in Ireland and the world.

## Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: For the past few years, Ireland and nations around the world have been lax towards the issue of sexual abuse. According to the RAINN association, each year there about 237,868 victims of sexual assault in the United States alone. One in four people in Ireland experience sexual abuse. 27% of these victims are under the age of 18, and 45% of the cases involve family. But, the worst part about these statistics is nobody has even tried to stop the issue. One major issue is that Ireland puts the sex offenders on a list for no more than five years. Many people would agree that five years does not give a person enough time to change themselves drastically. There is also not any form of an international sex offenders list. Ireland will lead this effort.

Section I: All convicted sex offenders will be added to a list and their name will remain on the list for life. This list may be openly viewed by the public. All participating nations will add the sex offenders in their country to this list, and they too will remain on the list for life.

Section II: In the event that a registered sex offender moves into a new home, all neighbors with a radius of 204 meters or 400 feet will be notified by the authorities.

Section III: Also in the event that a registered sex offender decides to move to a new home, they will not be allowed to live within a radius of 3.2 kilometers or 2 miles of a school zone. This includes public and private schools, plus colleges and universities. This will prevent sex offenders from becoming too close to children when they walk to and from school.

Section IV: Sex offenders will not be allowed on properties of public organizations that have minors such as schools, day cares, and preschools during operating hours.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect one month after this bill is mandated.
