Justification Clause: Jamaica is going through a shortage of water due to a series of droughts and other factors. Crops in the fields are dying, household toilets are needed to be flushed, and the sewage plants are suffering. With this water shortage, Jamaica has a major problems that affect all people. Some examples are personal household needs, the tourism business, and the people who make their living growing crops. Using "Reclaimed" water would be one solution to help ease Jamaica's water burden and other countries that have low water supplies.

Section I: Jamaica will "reclaim" the water supply so it is locally controlled, dependable, and a benefit to the environment.

Section II: Reclaimed water is water that is treated and reused before it passes back into the natural water cycle. Jamaica would use the "reclaim" water to water the sugarcane and other crops, for waste treatments such as flushing toilets and sewage plants, and other non consumed needs. This can protect the clean consumable water supply.

Section III: The UN would send in volunteers or needed people into Jamaica to help build the needed pipelines for the "reclaim" water and teach the people of Jamaica how to work pipelines. When finished, this would create jobs for the citizens of Jamaica.
