1 A proposal to create educational programs for the citizens of Mexico to inform them of the dangers of  
2 drugs.  
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4 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

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6 **Justification Clause:** This is a problem in Mexico because drug abuse creates danger that starts violence in  
7 Mexico. Drug cartels have claimed more than 55,000 lives. The police forces are supposed to help prevent  
8 these crimes from happening, but instead some are corrupt. They take bribes to pull a blind eye over these
