Action on Proposal

An act to establish justice against human trafficking and reinforce human rights.

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: Human trafficking is one of the fastest growing criminal industries in the world. It is a major problem in Uzbekistan as the government also contributes to trafficking people. To aid in preventing and stopping trafficking, we will enforce the laws to be more strict and specific. We will also make the punishment for committing this crime harsher.

Section I: We propose to enforce a document called "The End of Human Traifficking." This document consists of three parts. Part one is to make punishment for committing the crime of trafficking 12 years instead of only 3 years of jail time and also a 100,000 dollar fine in US dollars which is equivalent to 2,500,000 som in Uzbekistan currency. The second part is to enforce airport security by having security officers examine passports and birth certificates because people who are trafficked often don't have real ones. The additional security needed will be funded with the money collected from the fines that violators of the document "The End of Human Trafficking" have paid. If no violators are prosecuted, our sponsors will fund security until violators are caught. The third part is to have a class required for all the Uzbekistan people on the harshness of human trafficking. The teachers of this class will be people from the United Nations and the teachers will be paid by the Uzbekistan government.

Section II: Our intention is to put an end to human trafficking as a whole in Uzbekistan. In addition to that, we will also stop the import and export of people in other countries affilicated with trafficking.

Section III: To further address the abuse of human rights problem, government officials who have been suspected of participating in trafficking will be investigated and prosectuted by UN officials.

Section IV: We will partner with End It Movement to raise awareness and prevention of trafficking in Uzbekistan. End It Movement is an organization that fights for freedom by having people use their voices. They will broadcast the issue of trafficking in Uzbekistan which would get the word out. In 2014, End It Movement has raised \$116,735.50 in the fight for freedom. We will also partner with Polaris Project, UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund), and World Vision to help victims of trafficking. These groups will take care of victims so they can fully recover and get their lives back on track. These are non-profitable organizations so housing and helping victims won't cost anything.

Section V: This bill will go into effect immediately after passing.
