A proposal to provide justice to those who are downtrodden because of their beliefs, appearance, or race.

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: In many countries around the world there is racial discrimination. Groups such as NAACP, NCLR, and EEOC help to improve the lives of those who are victims of this inequality. Many countries in South America and the Caribbean have citizens descended from African slaves that are victims of discrimination. This proposal hopes to create global awareness to this problem.

Section I: The NAACP (National Association for the Advancement of Colored People), the NCLR (National Council of La Raza), and the EEOC (Equal Employment Opportunity Commission) in addition to any UN member would each choose 2 representatives, and have the United Nations General Assembly vote on 2 others (for a total of 4 representatives), who would report to the U.N. General Assembly any instances of racial discrimination exhibited in the countries to which they are assigned. Any non-governmental organizations may appoint an observer to this program. But the observer shall not vote.

Section II: The Global Consortium on Social Discrimination (GRSD) would be created and would vote on whether or not certain nations are guilty of social discrimination. If these nations are guilty of racial discrimination, economic sanctions may be enforced against that country until steps are taken to prevent social discrimination.
