5 6 7 8 9	Justification Clause: Cuba's economy and people have suffered because Cuba's infrastructure is failing, people are jobless and lack basic freedoms. Cuba's relations with the United States have not been on good terms since the 1950's. With this proposal, we will create jobs and a free market economy and improve Cuba's relations with the U.S. by beginning trade and travel opportunities.
10 11 12 13 14 15	Section I: This proposal will have 3 phases. Each phase will take one year. Phase one will begin the rebuilding of the Cuban infrastructure. Jobs will be created to improve the living conditions of the people of Cuba. Free enterprise will also be started so that Cubans can provide food and supplies to the citizens without government control. Phase 2 will end trade sanctions against Cuba and reopen trading with the U.S. Phase 3 will allow for freedom to travel between Cuba and the U.S.
16 17 18 19 20	Section II: Cuban diplomats will meet with U.S. diplomats to come to an agreement on ending trade sanctions and reopening trading. The United Nations Department of Economics and Social Affairs will advise and assist with the negotiations. The Cuban government will set up free enterprise opportunities and provide the money for rebuilding the infrastructure and creating jobs.
21 22 23 24	Section III: The Cuban government will provide the money needed to rebuild the infrastructure and create jobs. The UNDESA will provide the assistance and money needed to have the negotiations take place between the United States and Cuba. Money will also be provided to help Cubans set up free enterprise markets for food and supplies.
