An act to stop Gang Involvement of children within the countries of Guatemala and other countries of the world

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: The United Nations will provide educational assistance to Guatemala and those countries who are provided additional security to capture gang members and rehabilitate them into law abiding citizens

Section I: Criminal Youth Gangs is a group of troubled young school age children who have chosen criminal activities as a way of survival. Guatemala has approximately 10,000–14,000 street youth gang members.

Section II: The United Nations will provide financial assistance to Guatemala and those countries who choose to reform Youth gang members into a law abiding way of life.

Section III: The United Nations Judicial Division and the United Nation Social divisions will provide Educational Services for those countries implementing programs to reform gang members, which will be overseen by the Roman Catholic Dioceses.

Section IV: Funding will be provided for Educational Rehabilitation Centers which would include building, staff and other operational expense from the sell of property obtained when captured (ie: vehicles, houses, boats, guns); donations from private organizations; and other developed countries.

Section V: The funding, and Educational Rehabilitation Centers will be provided by the Roman Catholic Church in collaboration with the Guatemala Government and Judicial Division and Social Division of the United Nations.

Section VI: The United Nations will provide 500,000 dollars to start the first initial Educational Rehabilitation Center in Guatemala City, Guatemala. To begin once the bill is enacted.
