An act to establish community greenhouses in Haiti.

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: Haiti is the poorest country in the western hemisphere. Eighty percent of Haiti’s population lives in poverty, forty percent of households (3.8 million people) are undernourished, and thirty percent of children suffer from chronic malnutrition. This is largely due to the loss of once-fertile land to deforestation and soil erosion. In order to combat these difficulties we propose that community greenhouses be established to provide supplemental nutritious food to Haitian citizens.

Section I: Currently, USAID, an entity of the United States government, has begun a local greenhouse initiative in Haiti. In order to expand its effectiveness and make this an international initiative, the United Nations requests that member nations provide tiers of assistance:

- Tier 1: All three types of assistance- raw building materials, raw agricultural materials, and building/agricultural expertise.
- Tier 2: Two types of assistance.
- Tier 3: One type of assistance.

Section II: When member nations comply with this proposal, they will enjoy reduced taxes on imports from Haiti in proportion to tier level. The largest import categories are knit apparel, woven apparel, edible fruit and nuts, and cocoa.

Section III: This program will be re-evaluated biannually to determine the effectiveness of nation participation and reduction of malnutrition of the Haitian population.

Section IV: This proposal will go into effect within 90 days of passage.
