1 An act to promote mentorship programmes for refugees and unemployed Malaysian citizens.

2  
3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5 Justification Clause: As of 2013, more than 200,000 refugees registered in the United Nations High  
6 Commission in Malaysia. Approximately 70,000 people residing in Malaysia are considered stateless.  
7 Refugees struggle to find citizenship and jobs in Malaysia and their rights are limited. Over 100,000  
8 refugees reside in urban areas and struggle to find jobs. With a system to educate incoming refugees and  
9 existing unemployed Malaysian citizens, Malaysia would benefit from the growth of industry and economy  
10 through a mentoring programme.

11  
12 Section I: The United Nations High Commission on Refugees (UNHCR) will help develop a programme where  
13 refugees will be taught by a member of the working population in Malaysia to be a functioning member of  
14 the Malay workforce through skilled apprenticeship, and reward citizens for undertaking the responsibility.

15  
16 Section II: Refugees will choose from the available jobs and apprenticeships, which will change based on the  
17 needs of the local economy. The citizens will be rewarded with a 15% bonus for undertaking an apprentice.  
18 The UNHCR will assist in fundraising efforts to pay the increased salary.

19  
20 Section III: The mentorship shall last one year, and once completed the refugee will be awarded citizenship.  
21 Only one apprenticeship per refugee.

22  
23 Section IV: During the period of mentorship, the refugee can choose to live with their mentor. The UNHCR  
24 will assist in the placement and compensation for this.

25  
26 Section V: To repay the UNHCR, the refugee shall remain in the trained industry until costs have been  
27 repaid, either through wage garnishment or mentoring other refugees.

29 Section VI: This proposal will go into effect 90 days upon passage to allow the UNHCR to coordinate  
30 efforts.
