1 An act to create equal opportunities for all social economic groups in Panama.

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3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

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5 Justification Clause: In Panama, over half the population lives in poverty. Numbers show this poverty is
6 concentrated in rural areas, with a quarter of those people experiencing extreme poverty. The indigenous
7 people of Panama, suffer even worse. The main cause of poverty are lack of education and job opportunities.

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9 Section I: Poverty is the state of being poor or not having enough money to take care of basic needs such as
10 food, clothing, and housing. Developed countries will help provide free education to the people of Panama,
11 by partnering with Teachers Across Borders, in order to offer opportunities to find alternative methods to
12 supply basic needs for the people of Panama

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14 Section II: The course will focus on the importance of education, independent living skills, and job skills. Any
15 13-18 year old will be able to take the education course voluntarily. The education course will be offered
16 throughout rural communities.

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18 Section III: To encourage students to take the education course ;the students and his or her family will be
19 receive an incentive for the family.

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21 Section IV: The United Nations Social Division will provide educational resources for Panama. The Teachers
22 Across Borders will provide free educational services. Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Educational Division
23 will provide supplies.

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25 Section V: This proposal will be in effect once the bill has been enacted.
