1	An act to build more refugee camps in Somalia
2	
3	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
4	
5	Justification Clause: Somalia is currently engulfed in anarchy, struggling with starvation, dehydration and
6	homelessness. Somalia has a few refugee camps already present but the camps are over-crowded and
7	cannot support the increasing number of Somalis who can't maintain their everyday needs. 2.34 million
8	Somalis still need life-saving assistance. In southern parts of the country, 1.7 million people need food, clean
9	water, shelter and other assistance just to survive in Somalia. Mortality rates remain among the highest in
10	the world. 35% of children under the age of 5 die every year due to dehydration alone! The refugee camps
11	can make water more accessible by digging wells within the camps. More permanent structures within the
12	camps will provide better shelter during harsh weather and making food more available will ensure that
13	Somalis aren't dying of starvation or exposure.
14	
15	Section I: This proposal would build refugee camps in the five cities of Dodo, El Dobbo, Wanlaweyn, Bargaal,
16	and Bu'aale. Providing refugees with clean water, food and shelter are part of the Millennium goal set by the
17	UN to end poverty. The refugees will be employed to dig wells and build the shelters. This will provide them
18	with skills to use in the future and build up the country's ability to cope with future drought – and thereby
19	reduce their dependence on foreign aid.
20	

Section II: The United Nations Development Fund will provide the necessary materials for building wells and
shelters. Food will be provided by the World Food Program and a network of agencies and charitable
organizations with UN peacekeepers protecting the food distribution to the refugees.

Section III: The refugees will be actually building the refugee camps and digging the wells with supervision by
the UN Development workers. UN peacekeepers will be used to protect the food supply.
