Since 1946, the Kentucky YMCA has proudly sponsored the Kentucky Youth Assembly, or KYA – the nation's largest Youth and Government program for middle and high school students.

As delegates to KYA, students can serve as Representatives and Senators, Justices and Attorneys, Cabinet Secretaries, Lobbyists, and members of our Media Corps. During the fall, delegates work with their school delegations to research and write legislation that they will sponsor at the Assembly.

The 2017 Session of KYA was also our largest program yet. Over the course of 7 assemblies – 3 High School and 4 Middle School – the Y served more students, families, schools, and communities than ever before.


Each Youth Governor is elected by his/her peers to serve for a full yearlong term with their fellow KYA Presiding Officers.

At each KYA, Governors meet with sponsors of bills passed by the House and Senate, and consult with the Cabinet and Budget Committee before deciding to sign or veto each bill.

To remove all statues honoring Confederate soldiers from the Kentucky Capitol Building
