4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

6	Section 1: This bill will require citizens receiving unemployment benefits to perform five (5) hours of
7	community service each week.
8	
9	Section 2: This bill applies only to members of the labor force ages 18-65 who have been receiving
10	unemployment benefits for greater than four (4) months.
11	
12	Section 3: The citizens performing the service will transport themselves to the service site.
13	
14	Section 4: This bill will be enforced by the Unemployment Office.
15	
16	Section 5: The citizen performing the service will report to the Unemployment Office each week to receive a
17	form which will later be signed by the supervisor at the service site. The form will be turned in the
18	following week to the Unemployment Office in order to receive unemployment benefits.
19	
20	Section 6: There is no additional cost for this bill.
