An act to exempt veterans from taxation known as the "Veteran Exemption from Taxation Act".

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill is presented to support veterans who comprise .45% of the United States population. This bill will have a direct impact on Kentucky veterans in order to assist and support this small population from enduring poverty and homelessness.

Section 2: A veteran is defined by federal law, moral code, and military service as any person who served for any length of time in any military service branch and has received an Honorable Discharge or Under Honorable Conditions status.

Section 3: Retirees during and prior to 1997 in the state of Kentucky cannot be taxed by the state, however any one veteran who retired after 1997 can be taxed with an income based at \$41,110 or higher. There will be no military retirement income tax nor state personal income tax.

Section 4: Kentucky is the 39th least favorable state for a veteran to live in as of 2014 in terms of benefits, and it is listed as the 49th worst state in terms of veteran job opportunities.

Section 5: The cost of this bill will be financed and regulated by federal guidelines similar to those in other states where active duty military are tax exempt.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect January 1st, the year after it is been passed.
