1                                   An act to guarantee voting rights to ex-convicts upon release.

3                                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5   Section 1: Individuals convicted of a felony in the state of Kentucky are guaranteed the right to vote  
6 immediately upon completion of their sentence and release form incarceration.

7  
8   Section 2: Individuals convicted of a felony in the state of Kentucky are not guaranteed the right to vote  
9 while on probation or parole.

10  
11   Section 3: Individuals convicted of a felony in the state of Kentucky pertaining to treason or voting fraud will  
12 not have the ability to regain their right to vote.

13  
14   Section 4: Upon their second release and completion of any probation/parole, repeat offenders must wait 5  
15 years to regain the right to vote.

16  
17   Section 5: Upon their third release and completion of any probation/ parole, repeat offenders must wait 10  
18 years to regain the right to vote.

19  
20   Section 6: Upon their fourth release and completion of any probation/parole, repeat offenders will no longer  
21 be able to regain their right to vote.

22  
23   Section 7: The government would not have any fiscal responsibility regarding the voting rights of ex-  
24 convicts.

25  
26   Section 8: The current system of application for executive pardon is voided.

27  
28   Section 9: This bill will go into effect January 2nd, 2016.
