1	An act to improve high school security.
2	
3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4	
5	Section 1: Each high school in Kentucky will be required to institute a Student Emergency Assistance Team
6	(SEAT).
7	
8	Section 2: SEATs will receive training from the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security and local law
9	enforcement agencies on how to properly secure a high school in emergency situations.
10	
11	Section 3: SEATs will educate students and faculty on proper security protocol within the schools; SEATs will
12	also serve as student security liaisons and will act as the first line of contact for administration.
13	
14	Section 4: Emergency situations include: bullying, lockdowns, natural disasters, and infectious diseases.
15	
16	Section 5: Students interested in serving on SEAT must complete a rigorous training program the summer
17	prior to servingat their own expense. They will also be subject to monthly drug tests.
18	
19	Section 6: Aside from mandatory summer training and drug testing, each school will be responsible for
20	setting guidelines for participation in SEAT.
21	
22	Section 7: School districts that do not comply will be required to implement an alternative form of student
23	administrative duties.
24	
25	Section 8: Any additional funding will be provided by the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security.
26	
27	Section 9: This bill will go into effect two years after passage.
