1 An act to attain and maintain affordable tuition and fees for state-funded post-secondary schools in the
2 Commonwealth of Kentucky.
3
4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
5
6 Section 1: Whereas post-secondary education continues to be a priority for many Kentuckians, but as tuition
7 rates increase, a college education is becoming more financially difficult to attain. In order to expand higher
8 education opportunities for Kentuckians, an affordable tuition rate must be secured and maintained.

10 Section 2: The yearly increase of in-state tuition and fees of state-funded post-secondary schools shall be
11 limited to a percentage equal to or less than the rate of inflation in the previous fiscal year.

13 Section 3: The student-to-faculty ratio of these state-funded post-secondary schools may not be increased
14 by more than five percent in one year.
15
16 Section 4: If a state-funded post-secondary school fails to maintain the provisions specified in sections two
17 and three, the state will discontinue state funding provided to the school. If a school desires to regain state
18 funding, it must amend its tuition and fees to correspond to the rate of inflation or less for the period of
19 non-compliance with sections one and two.

21 Section 5: This bill will go into effect upon the commencement of the Commonwealth of Kentucky's next
22 fiscal year, beginning July 1st, 2015.
