1 An act to ban the utilization of handheld and hands-free devices while operating motorized vehicles.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will require that the Kentucky State Police (KSP) enforce consequences on Kentuckians

6 that utilize handheld and hands-free devices while operating motorized vehicles.

8 Section 2: The purpose of this bill is to lower the percentage of injuries and fatalities caused by cellphones in

9 the state of Kentucky. Cell phone distractions cause over 2,000 deaths and over 330,000 injuries each year

10 in the United States.

12 Section 3: This bill when implemented will cost no additional funding.

14 Section 4: Failure to abide by this law will result in the following penalties:

15 1st Offense: \$50 fine

16 2nd Offense: \$100 fine

17 3rd Offense: \$150 fine with 3 points added to your license

18 4th Offense: \$200 fine plus court costs and 30 days jail time

20 Section 5: This bill will go into effect six months after passage and with signature of the governor.
