1 An act to Require All Public Food Service Establishments in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to Visibly Display
2 Sanitation Inspection Ratings.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: All public food service establishments in the Commonwealth of Kentucky will hereby be required to
7 display sanitation inspection ratings within the premise of the establishment in a manner clearly visible to
8 patrons of the establishment.

10 Section 2: This program is to be overseen by the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Human Services. The
11 Kentucky Food Code currently requires the periodic inspection of all food establishment in Kentucky. The
12 objective scores generated through these inspections will be utilized for the purpose of this bill. All sanitation
13 ratings required to be displayed by public food establishments will come directly from these periodic
14 inspections. The criteria for the sanitation inspection will be the criteria already determined by the Kentucky
15 Cabinet for Health and Human Services for use in periodic inspections.

17 Section 3: Paper signs of a standard form and size containing sanitation ratings will be provided to each
18 food service establishment immediately after the inspection. The paper signs will include a letter grade that
19 corresponds to the percentage score received by the food establishment through the inspection. The letter
20 to percentage conversion will be defined as follows:
21 A = 90% - 100%
22 B = 80% - 89%
23 C = 70% - 79%
24 F = 69% or below
25 It is the requirement of the food service establishment owner to ensure the sign is displayed in a visible
26 manner.
