- 1 An act to require all Kentucky medical centers to undergo mandatory Ebola outbreak training.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: Currently, in the United States, the deadly disease Ebola has become an issue that many medical
- 6 centers are unequipped to treat. We as Kentuckians must prepare for the potential danger for this disease
- 7 and other possible infectious diseases that may arise.

- 9 Section 2: This bill aims to prep all Kentucky medical centers with the proper training and equipment needed
- 10 to handle either an Ebola outbreak or another infectious disease that we are not prepared for.

- 12 Section 3: Ebola is transmitted via contact with bodily fluids of someone who is infected with the disease. All
- 13 Kentucky medical staff that treat and are involved with patients must be required to undergo specific
- 14 training on how to properly manage and control the disease. They will also be provided the proper equipment
- 15 and materials needed to protect both themselves and other patients.

- 17 Section 4: Funding for this bill will be provided from the hospitals budget. This will not affect the taxpayers
- 18 of the Commonwealth.

- 20 Section 5: This bill will go into effect January 1st, 2015.
