1                   An act to prohibit the usage and/or consideration of foreign law in courts.

3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: As used in this bill;

6 (a.)"foreign law" is law referenced or cited by a court other than that in which the court sits. This applies to a  
7 violation of a citizen's constitutional rights.

9 Section 2: Punishments for extreme acts, even with religious justification, will remain the same, as long as  
10 enforcement.

11

12 Section 3: Currently, foreign law can be considered and even voted into law in cities/states in the United  
13 States. This bill will prohibit the usage of these radical ideals in the state of Kentucky, following the examples  
14 of related laws in six other states: Oklahoma, Louisiana, Tennessee, Arizona, Kansas, and South Dakota.

16 Section 4: This act includes crime such as violence, child custody, divorce, punishment, physical/sexual  
17 assault, etc.

18

19 Section 5: This law would go into effect January 1, 2015.
