- 1 An act to require all pharmacies in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to have a drop off box available to
- 2 customers for their unused prescriptions and medicine.
- 3
- 4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 5
- 6 Section 1: This bill prevents unused prescription medication from being dumped into community's water
- 7 systems and landfills, helping prevent the contamination of animals and humans alike.
- 8
- 9 Section 2: This bill help prevents the medication from getting into the "wrong hands", such as drug addicts,
- 10 dealers, and minors.
- 11
- 12 Section 3: Every pharmacy will be provided a drop off box at the partial expense of the Department of
- 13 Health for prescriptions to be disposed of safely.
- 14
- 15 Section 4: This law will be enforced by the officials at the Department of Health. Pharmacies not in
- 16 compliance with this law will be fined at graduated increments starting at \$500 and increasing by \$500 with
- 17 each offense up to five offences. After the fifth offense, the pharmacy will lose their license.
- 18
- 19 Section 5: The bill will go into effect the following year.
