1 An act to require every resident that applies for the SNAP program to comply to a drug test every six  
2 months along with the re-application process.

3  
4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5  
6 Section 1: Every Kentucky Resident that applies for the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)  
7 must comply to a drug test every six months along with the re-application process.

9 Section 2: The estimated cost of this bill (2,373,300) was figured by taking the average amount of recipients  
10 multiplied by 15 divided by the population of KY to get 0.58 cents per tax payer per year. The applicant will  
11 be paying fifteen dollars up front to be tested which between the applicant and tax payer covers the \$30  
12 cost of a drug test.

14 Section 3: The penalty for failing the drug test would be that the applicant is put on probation for 12 weeks  
15 and tested at the end of the first six weeks and the end of the second six weeks, the applicant would be  
16 paying the full \$30 for both probation tests. The probation period restarts when the applicant fails his or her  
17 drug test and if they fail 3 they are suspended indefinitely. However if they pass both probation drug tests  
18 they will resume the normal every six month application process.

19  
20 Section 4: In the application, the applicants will be informed of the drug testing. When they sign the  
21 application, they will be consenting to a drug test.

22  
23 Section 5: This bill will be enacted January 1st, 2016.
