Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

An act to inhibit personal social media from being punishable in any school without reasonable cause.

Section 1; This bill will cease any school punishments that could be received for a social media post from a personal account, unless the school administration or district officials have reasonable cause to search your accounts. Reasonable cause can be justified when a student, or person, brings a specific post to the attention of the school/school district that is of direct targeting of a specific person that carries a negative connotation. This bill hopes to prevent a student from being punished in school for tweeting about a fight, a party, a rumor, or anything that has no direct relation to the school, or person within the school.

Section 2: If schools fail to follow this policy, then any punishment/consequence that arises from the student's social media post cannot be upheld. The student(s) who are in trouble can take this to court where punishments for not abiding by this law will be determined by the court.

Section 3: This bill follows and supports the first amendment which states: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech..."

Section 4: This bill will have minimal costs to the school or state.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect immediately after passage.
