An act to provide for the secure disposal of unused narcotics in all Kentucky counties

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Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Each county in the state of Kentucky shall be required to have a secure facility for the disposal of unused narcotics.

Section 2: Each facility shall be a secure receptacle and approved structure which meets applicable Federal guidelines for the receipt and temporary storage of prescription drugs, prior to their disposal.

Section 3: The sheriff shall coordinate with the State Office of Drug Control Policy to arrange appropriate disposal of all unused narcotics pursuant to applicable Federal regulations.

Section 4: The number of disposal sites shall vary based on the county's population. Counties with populations greater than 100,000, according to the 2010 census, may apply to the State Office of Drug Control Policy for additional locations. This statute in no way limits individual counties from supplying additional disposal sites beyond those provided for herein.

Section 5: The organization and oversight of this Act shall be provided by the Kentucky State Office of Drug Control Policy.

Section 6: Each disposal site authorized and funded by this Act will be overseen by the county sheriff, who shall provide appropriate security for the site. The sheriff shall coordinate with the State Office of Drug Control Policy for the disposal of the drugs collected.

Section 7: Drugs prescribed by a physician, but not fully used by the intended patient, may be disposed at these locations. Illegal drugs and paraphernalia shall not be accepted, but turned over to reporting police.

Section 8: Funding for this Act shall come from the general fund. Funding for this Act shall be limited to \$1 million dollars in General Funds for the installation of at least 120 facilities, located on site at the sheriff's office or other suitable locations approved by the Office of Drug Control Policy. Additional funds received from federal grants or as a result of the forfeiture of criminal proceeds may be used to supplement the General Fund appropriation.

Section 9: Section 9: This Act shall be effective August 1, 2015.
