1 An act to require public schools in Kentucky to recycle paper and plastic waste.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will require public schools to establish a recycling program for paper and plastic waste.

7 Section 2: It will be the responsibility of each school to have separate recycling bins for paper and plastic
8 around the school. Schools will also be responsible for the disposal of the recyclables at a recycling center,
9 even if the school's county does not have a recycling center of its own. Additionally, it is required of schools
10 to inform students and staff of their new recycling program so as to encourage recycling.

12 Section 3: Schools in need of funds to establish a recycling program may ask the state for the required
13 funds. These funds will come out of the Kentucky Lottery.

15 Section 4: Schools who do not establish a recycling program will be fined \$200 a month until the program is
16 established. Schools will not be punished, however, for the occasional or accidental disposal of recyclables in
17 with the regular waste by students or staff as long as a recycling program is still in place

18
19 Section 5: This bill will take effect July 1, 2015.
