1 An act to require drug testing for people who receive unemployment checks.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: We are proposing this bill to make people who receive an unemployment check take a drug test to
6 ensure that they are not using the government's money to buy drugs. People need to take this drug test so
7 that government can make sure that their money is not being used for unlawful purposes.

9 Section 2: There is already a law in the state of Texas that says when people file for unemployment they
10 have to take a drug test. We believe that this law should also apply for the state of Kentucky.

12 Section 3: This bill will apply for all the people who receive an unemployment check. If someone refuses to
13 take the drug test, or they fail the test, the following punishments will apply:

15 1st Offense: You will be warned and are given 30 days to take the test
16
17 2nd Offense: Half of your unemployment check will be taken away
18
19 3rd Offense: All of your unemployment check will be taken away for that month
20
21 4th Offense: You will be sent to jail
22
23 Section 4: This bill will go into effect January 1st the year after it is passed.
