1	An Act to Create Charter Schools in Kentucky
2	
3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4	
5	Section 1: A charter school is an independently run, tuition free, public school. The schools will be run by an
6	independent non-profit board of directors allowing for more flexibility in its operations.
7	
8	Section 2: A public school requesting to be a charter school must apply for a charter to the Kentucky
9	Education Cabinet. The Education Cabinet will issue the charter that states the guidelines and restrictions as
10	set forth by the Kentucky State Legislature.
11	
12	Section 3: Students are admitted to the school through a random lottery open to the public. Once a family is
13	chosen from the lottery all students in the family may attend. Families from adjoining counties may enter the
14	lottery. Lottery applications will not include: previous test data, letters of recommendation, special services,
15	gender, race, religion, language spoken at home, or anything about the students other than name, address,
16	and phone number. Applications with any other information attached will be automatically rejected. If
17	enrollment guidelines are violated the school will be fined the current cost of educating a student, as
18	calculated by the Education Cabinet, for each violation. Bus transportation will be provided to students living
19	within the county public school system by the rules of the system. Any students attending from outside the
20	system will have to arrange their own transportation.
21	
22	Section 4: Funding: The school will receive 92% of the school funding as a regular public school on a per pupil
23	enrolled basis. Any other funds needed must be obtained through, grants, donations, sponsors, and/or loans.
24	
25	Section 5: This law will go into effect upon the signature of the Governor.
